- + This bird is one of the smallest ducks in the world
- + They feed on the surface of the water, dipping their heads underwater with the tail in the air, this is known as "up-ending"
- + This species of duck nests up high in trees and can often be seen perched up high in branches

Argusianus argus

- + The male of this species has a long, beautiful train of feathers. They have a loud call which travels several kilometres
- + They tend to live in lowland forests
- + Argus pheasants are threatened in the wild through destruction of their habitat and hunting for their prized feathers

Red fronted macaw

Ara rubrogenys

- + Named for the red patch at the front of the head above the beak, these birds also have red edges to their wing
- + There are less than 2,700 left in Bolivia and they are part of a managed breeding programme
- + Unlike many parrot species, they nest on cliff faces
