- + They are important in the Indian state of Haryana where they are the official state bird
- + You can recognise the male bird by his black chest and head and the white patch on his cheek

- + They can only be found in the wild on the island of Bali in Indonesia

- + These birds are small, energetic and sociable birds and can flock in groups of over 100. They are widely sought by breeders and as pets
- + They love to chirp loudly, making a sound similar to a toy trumpet!
- + They get their name from the black and white stripes on their tail

Yellow billed teal

- + This bird, also known as the sharp-winged teal, is a common South American duck
- + Those that live on higher ground are a pale silvery colour, whilst lowland birds are often a darker, greyish brown colour
- + In flight and when excited, males will make a creaky "peet" call
